## GENERAL INFORMATION FOR GUESTS

Ottawa, the capital of Canada, is accessible by plane, train, bus, and automobile (and canal boat!). Buses from the airport service the two major downtown hotels, the Lord Elgin and the Chateau Laurier, reservation cards for both of which are being sent with this mailing. The hotels are within a pleasant walking distance of the University Centre, where all the meetings will be held; maps will be furnished at the Centre.

Members of the Society coming from the United States should note two points: (1) Hotel rates are quoted in Canadian, not U.S., dollars. (2) U.S. tax laws allow deductions for travel expenses to conventions in non-U.S. cities only if at least half the days of the trip are devoted to convention business, and for subsistence expenses (up to the maximum established by the U.S. government for the city in which the convention is held) only if at least four hours of convention-related meetings are attended on a given day; therefore, the present Co-Secretaries (Professors Schrag and McBride) will have available simple forms to sign to testify to attendance at the sessions, for those who wish to have them.
