I. The following motion, proposed by Nancy Fraser, Iris Young, and William McBride, was passed: The SPEP program shall be determined in a fashion which maximizes fairness and participation. To this end, the following principles shall be adhered to:

1. There shall be blind reviewing of all submissions (including papers and session proposals). Submitters will be instructed to omit names of all speakers from proposals and to list them on a separate cover sheet only. A person having no role in decision-making shall be designated to receive submissions and to delete all identifying references before passing them on to the referees.

2. Except for plenary sessions, there shall be no distinctions among session types (i.e., no distinctions between workshops vs. panels vs. symposia, etc.).

3. Ideally, two-thirds of all papers shall be selected from among submissions. When the number of good submissions warrants, those setting up the program should consider increasing the number of speaking slots over the current number by scheduling more concurrent sessions.

4. The call for papers shall invite submissions on the special themes desired for that year.

5. The call for papers should be widely published among philosophers and others interested in Continental philosophy. In addition to being mailed to the SPEP membership, the call should appear in at least the following publications: *The Proceedings of the APA*, *the Journal of Philosophy*, *the Newsletter of the Society for Women in Philosophy*, *the Review of Metaphysics*.

6. The call for papers shall be mailed and published by November 1 and the deadline for submission shall be February 15.

7. Decisions about submissions shall be made at a meeting held concurrently with the Central Division APA meetings and all submitters shall be notified of decisions by June 1.

8. Reactions to the current year's program and suggestions for themes for sessions at next year's meeting shall be part of the agenda of each year's business meeting to be held before the reception.

9. Every effort shall be made to make the program as diverse as possible in its representation of constituencies and of philosophical approaches to Continental philosophy.

II. Don Ihde proposed a resolution that two members of the current Executive Committee and two sponsors of the motion on the program meet at the APA meeting in Boston to review the present structure of SPEP. The motion passed.

III. Charles E. Scott (Vanderbilt University) was elected as Co-Director of SPEP.

IV. Arleen B. Dallery (LaSalle University) was elected as Co-Director of SPEP.

V. Stephen Watson (University of Notre Dame) was elected to a three-year term on the Executive Committee.

VI. Lenore Langsdorf (University of Texas, Arlington) was elected to the Executive Committee for a one-year term.

VII. Sandra Bartky (University of Illinois at Chicago Circle) was elected to the Committee on the Status of Women.

VIII. Members voted to schedule the business meeting of SPEP on Friday.

IX. Donn Welton (SUNY at Stony Brook), Hugh Silverman (SUNY at Stony Brook) and Tom Flynn (Emory University) rotated off the Executive Committee.

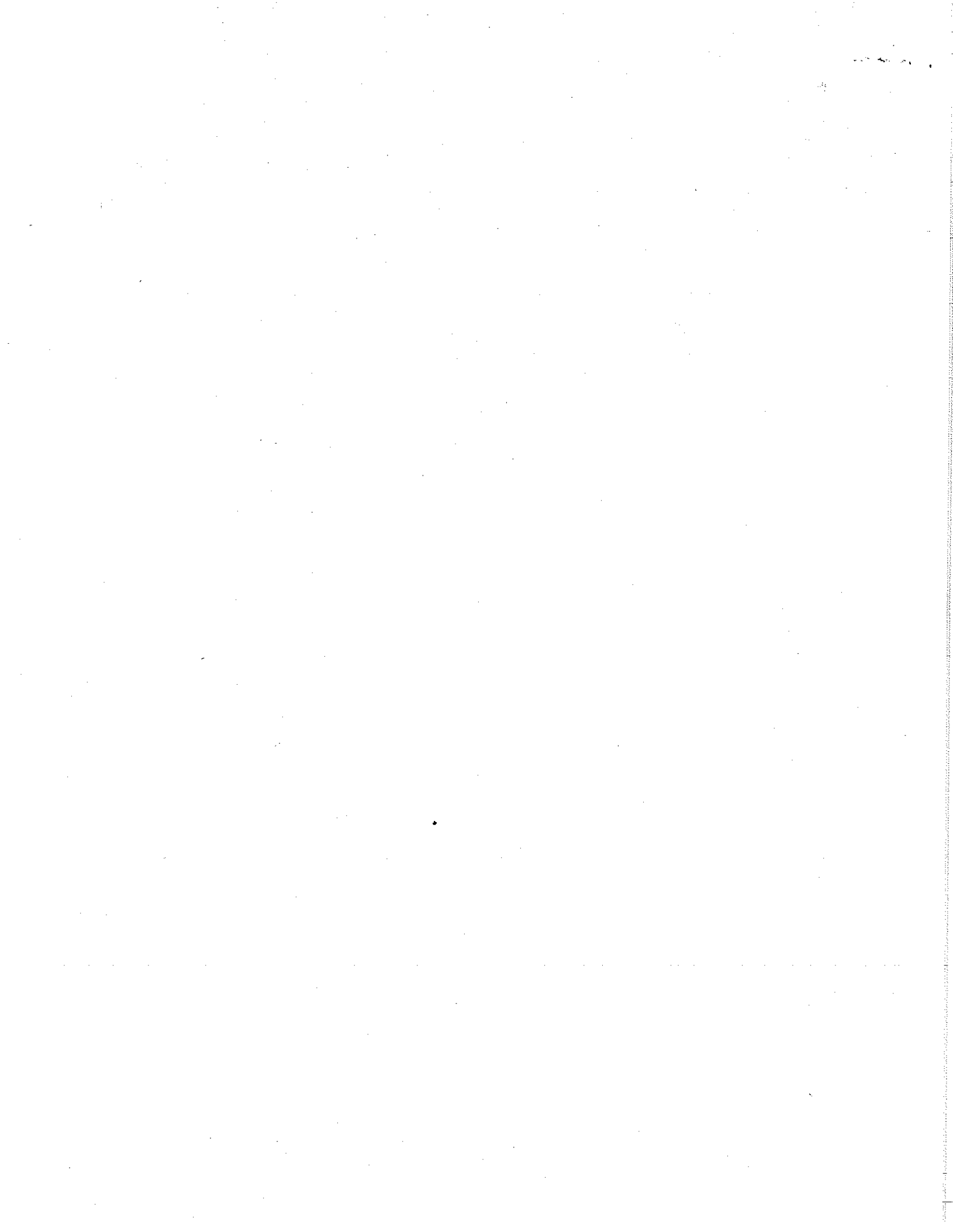
