Although complete versions of papers are preferred, detailed abstracts (several pages in length) will also be considered. For panel proposals, include both titles and abstracts for the panel as well as for each paper within the panel. Since paper and panel proposals are chosen through blind review, names of authors and organizers must be omitted from the papers and proposals and stated only on a separate cover sheet. Authors are asked to use gender-inclusive language, in accord with the "Guidelines For Non-Sexist Use of Language" published by the APA. (Copies are available from the APA National Office, University of Delaware, Newark, DE 19716; phone 302-451-1112.) Authors or Panel Organizers will hear from the Executive Committee by June 1, 1992. SPEP maintains the right of first review of presented papers for publication consideration in its edited volumes.
