The Committee will consider only complete papers of no more than 3,000 words, not abstracts; the Committee welcomes recommendations for possible chairs or commentators on these submissions. Panel proposals must include: a title, a chairperson, a proposal of 500 words for the panel as a whole, and either complete papers (of no more than 3,000 words) or abstracts of no less than 750 words for each paper in the panel. The Committee encourages submissions from all areas of continental philosophy. Since papers and panel proposals are chosen through blind review, names of authors and organizers must be stated only on a separate cover sheet and omitted from the proposals, papers, and footnotes. Please use gender-inclusive language in accord with the "Guidelines For Non-Sexist Use of Language" published by the APA. (Copies are available from the APA National Office, University of Delaware, Newark DE 19716; 302/831-1112.) Authors and Panel Organizers will hear from the Executive Committee by June 1, 1995. SPEP maintains the right of first review of presented papers for publication consideration in its edited volumes.
