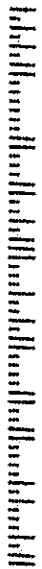

Format

Paper submissions must include complete papers (of no more than 3,000 words) and abstracts (of no more than 100 words). **Panel proposals** must include a title, a proposal of 500 words for the panel as a whole, and either complete papers (no more than 3,000 words) or abstracts (no fewer than 750 words) for each paper in the panel. Since **papers** and **panel proposals** are chosen through blind review, names and addresses of authors and organizers must be stated only on a separate cover sheet and omitted from the proposals, papers, and footnotes. The word count for papers should appear on the cover sheet; papers that exceed the 3,000 word limit will be returned to the author. Please use gender-inclusive language in accord with the "Guidelines for Non-Sexist Use of Language" published by the APA. (Copies are available from the APA National Office, University of Delaware, Newark DE 19716; 302/831-1112.) Also specify any AV equipment that will be needed.

Notification

Authors and panel organizers will hear from the Executive Committee by June 1, 1999. SPEP maintains the right of first review on presented papers for publication consideration in its edited volumes.
