THE TWENTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY MEETING

All sessions of the Twenty-lifth Annual Meeting of the Society for Phenomenology and Existential Philosophy will be held at Victoria College in the University of Toronto. Most sessions are on the first three floors of the older building of the College. Most plenary sessions will be in Northrop Frye Hall. Several sessions will be in Emmanuel College nearby. The Society expresses its appreciation and gratitude to Victoria College and the Philosophy Department of the University of Toronto for hosting these meetings.

The official SPEP Program begins at noon on Thursday, October 16th, 1986 and ends with the conclusion of the Anniversary Banquet on Saturday night. A number of special sessions have been planned for this year. The following items were decided during the 1985 Society for Phenomenology and Existential Philosophy Business Meeting:

- The invitation from Vanderbilt University to hold the 1988 SPEP Annual Meetings on their campus was approved by the membership. The membership was reminded that it had already accepted the invitation of the University of Notre Dame to hold the 1987 Meetings in South Bend.
- The recommendation by the Committee on the Status of Women in SPEP that there be a form with information data for women in the Society was amended to include all members. The Co-Directors agreed to include such a form in a future mailing and to develop a mechanism for compiling such information for use in planning future programs.
- The outgoing member of the Executive Committee, Professor Joseph J. Kockelmans was thanked for his faithful service during the past three years.
- 4. Professor Graeme Nicholson was elected to the Executive Committee for a term of three years.
- It was reported that the Executive Committee had made a commitment to nominate and present for approval a man and a woman as the new Co-Directors. Their three-year terms would begin following the 1986 anniversary meetings in Toronto.
- 6. It was reported that the Society is healthy and the number of members is growing. The membership was reminded that the Executive Office maintains a mailing list which publishers may purchase for one-time distribution of catalogues, announcements, and other information of potential interest to members.
- 7. Professor Werner Marx was congratulated for his achievements and for the recognition of his philosophical writings.
